## Iowa LULAC denounces racist comments made at high school game, offers support to schools to combat hate speech, racism

DES MOINES, IA – The League of United Latin American Citizens of Iowa has offered its support to the school districts in the spotlight of what has now become a national issue of hate speech and racism.

Earlier this week, players from the Perry High School basketball team were taunted with chants of "Trump! Trump!" and "USA!" The reference is to Donald Trump, who has spread hateful anti-immigrant rhetoric during his presidential campaign. The chants were made by students from Dallas Center-Grimes toward Perry players. Perry has a 48 percent minority student body.

"Donald Trump's name has now become the new four-letter word for our community," said Joe Enriquez Henry of Des Moines, National LULAC vice president of the Midwest region.

The issue extends much deeper than chants of "Trump!" and "USA," he said.

"Racism is something that is taught, it's a learned behavior," Enriquez Henry said. "If we can reach our youth at a young age and educate them about what constitutes racism and hate speech, maybe we can end these harmful actions with our next generation."

LULAC officials this week have reached out to administrators at both school districts to meet regarding the issue, district policies regarding racism and hate speech, and how the civil rights organization can offer assistance. Meetings have not yet been scheduled.

LULAC leaders met with school administrators in Marshalltown when a similar situation occurred there.
